The National Trust celebrate being at Formby for 50 years.




The 146th Open takes place in July at the Royal Birkdale.

“We want the children to put their artistic caps on and come up with a mascot that shows what the Coast means to them.”


Details about the competition will go out to schools and partners across Sefton.
